Problem 1: (worth 20 points)

Please submit an email letter that addresses each of the four subjects as follows:

1. Indicate some aspect of the course that you feel is particularly useful or helpful to your efforts to master the materials. Explain.

3. Name one physics concept or idea in the course that was particularly interesting or surprising or useful to you. Explain.

- The email must have a subject header line as follows:
